Eric KAUFMANN

Professor of Politics, Birkbeck College, University of London

Eric Kaufmann is Professor of Politics at Birkbeck College, University of London. He is the author of *Whiteshift: Immigration, Populism and the Future of White Majorities* (Penguin, October 2018). He has also written *Changing Places: mapping the white British response to ethnic change* (Demos 2014), *Shall the Religious Inherit the Earth: demography and politics in the twenty-first century* (Profile 2010), *The Rise and Fall of Anglo-America: the decline of dominant ethnicity in the United States* (Harvard 2004) and two other books. György SCHÖPFLIN MEP

*EPP Group Coordinator in the Committee on Constitutional Affairs
in the European Parliament*

Professor György Schöpflin was born in Budapest in 1939 and lived in the UK from 1950 to 2004.

He graduated M.A., LL.B. from the University of Glasgow (1962) and pursued postgraduate studies at the College of Europe in Bruges (1962-1963). He worked at the Royal Institute of International Affairs (1963-1967) and the BBC (1967-1976) before taking up university lecturing, at the school of Slavonic and East European Studies, University of London (1976-2004), including latterly as Jean Monnet Professor of Politics and Director of the Centre for the Study of Nationalism. Until 2011, he was teaching in Forlì, University Bologna, Faculty of Political Sciences. Professor Schöpflin's principal area of research is the relationship between ethnicity, nationhood and political power, with particular reference to post-communism. He is the author of *Politics in Eastern Europe 1945-1992* (Blackwell, 1993) and *Nations, Identity, Power* (Hurst, 2000), and co-editor of and contributor to *Myths and Nationhood* (Hurst, 1997, with Geoffrey Hosking) and *State Building in the Balkans: Dilemmas on the Eve of the 21st Century* (Longo, 1998, with Stefano Bianchini) and *The Dilemmas of Identity*, among many other publications. His latest book, *Politics Illusions, Fallacies* was published in 2012 by the University of Tallin. Professor Schöpflin was elected a Member of the European Parliament for Fidesz-Hungarian Civic Union, a member of the Group of the European People's Party (Christian Democrats) and European Democrats, in 2004, and re-elected in 2009 and 2014. He serves as the EPP group coordinator of Constitutional Affairs Committee (AFCO), he is a full member on the Parliament's Development Committee (DEVE) and a substitute member on the Foreign Affairs Committee (AFET) and its Subcommittee on Security and Defence (SEDE).

Paulo Rangel is a Member of the European Parliament since 2009 and Vice-chairman of the EPP Group, responsible for the EPP think tank, European Ideas Network. Member of the Constitutional Affairs Committee and member of the Delegation to the ACP-EU Joint Parliamentary Assembly, Mr. Rangel is as well Head of the Portuguese PSD Delegation and Administrator of the Robert Schuman Foundation, since 2009. Former Member of the Portuguese Parliament, on the 10th legislature, Mr. Rangel was the Chairman of PSD parliamentary group in 2008-2009. Prior to this, Paulo Rangel was Deputy Secretary of State in the Ministry of Justice under the 16th constitutional government. Law graduate, by the Catholic University of Oporto, Mr. Rangel has attended a master degree in juridical-political sciences, by the University of Coimbra, and attended a Doctorate in Public Law, by the Law faculty of Nova University of Lisbon. Lecturer in the Law Faculty of the Portuguese Catholic University and lecturer of the MBA in the Porto Business School. Mr Rangel is a member of the board of directors of the Porto Trade Association, chairman of the General Assembly of RAR Group and regular commentator in various branches of media. Mr. Rangel has made many speeches and lectures, scholarly articles and books on legal, political and constitutional issues, including *Repensar o Poder Judicial*, Publicações Universidade Católica, 2001, *O Estado do Estado*, D. Quixote, 2009. Research work: with the DAAD in Frankfurt, with the European Institute in Florence, the University of Osnabrück, the University of Upsala, the University of Lausanne, the University of Bologna, the University of Genoa and the University of Freiburg. Awarded the Grosse Verdienstkreuz mit Stern by the Federal Republic of German (2009); the Council of Europe's René Cassin Prize (1989); the D. António Ferreira Gomes Prize (1986).

Researcher at Wittgenstein Centre in Vienna

Tomáš Sobotka leads the research group on Fertility and Family at the Vienna Institute of Demography / Wittgenstein Centre for Demography and Human Global Capital. He holds a PhD in demography from the University of Groningen (the Netherlands). His research focuses on global low fertility and family changes, fertility timing, fertility data and measurement, assisted reproduction, migration and population change in Europe. In 2012-17, he was principal investigator in the European Research Council funded project analysing fertility and reproduction in Europe in the early 21st century (EURREP, www.eurrep.org). Tomáš Sobotka has helped launching and expanding several data repositories, including the Human Fertility Database (HFD, www.humanfertility.org). In 2017, he was awarded Allianz European Demographer Award.
